<u>Instructions for using T.A.S.C.O/Rittel's Bactericide</u> Catalog #PS-650

T.A.S.C.O/Rittel's Bactericide is an effective bactericide and fungicide. Unlike phenol, it only has a persistency of 8 months. It is an excellent phenol substitute. A bactericide is best used in your relaxing bath prior to pickling. It kills any bacterial growth, and protects it as it relaxes.

For use in your Relaxing Bath – Add 1 fl. oz. of PS-650 for each 16 lbs. of skins. This same dosage can also be used throughout the process.

In high humidity and Temperatures – Some tanners like to treat the skins with bactericide before salting. To use as a spray, mix 1 pint of PS-650 to 10 pints of water. Lightly spray the flesh and hair side of the skin, and then apply salt.

CAUTION

Eye and skin contact should be avoided when handling PS-650. Use rubber gloves and goggles when pouring and handling. Wash thoroughly with soap and water after handling. Do not discharge PS-650 solutions into lakes, streams, ponds, or public waters. PS-650 is toxic to fish.

First Aid Instruction's

If in the eyes, flush them with plenty of water. Get medical attention. IF on the skin, wash with plenty of soap and water. Get medical attention. FI swallowed, drink promptly, a large quantity of milk, egg whites, gelatin solution or if none of these are available, drink large quantities of water. Avoid alcohol. Get medical attention.
